


That's a difficult question for me since it's like asking which of my children is my favorite! We have twins so I'll answer in kind. Two courses have been extremely transformative for me during my experience at CTS. First, the 2016 Israel-Palestine course was a once in a lifetime experience for me and many others. Not only did we get to see the ancient and historic sites of the Bible, but we also engaged with contemporary issues of justice, power, and spiritual transformation. I had the pleasure of experiencing that trip alongside CTS professors, trustees, and other students

changed my life and was formative in my Constructive Theology thesis work that dealt with trauma and sacrifice in the Bible and also in operative theologies that abuse children in the Church. My future research at the University of

CTS has a reputation of doing justice work in balance with cutting-edge theological and biblical studies. Through the advice of some mentors, I decided to pursue the MDiv program at CTS as I approached graduation during undergrad. I knew CTS would be a place where I could grow, but the practical "hands-on" focus of the MDiv went

from all over the world. The second most transformative class for me is undoubtedly Ken Stone's "Animals and Ecology in the Bible" course. Ask anyone else in that class and they will tell you the same. That course literally




